## Questions and Responses – RFQ for Electric Transmission Engineering, Planning and Consulting Services

### Question 1:

The second sentence in the paragraph at the top of page 9 of the RFQ states:

*“The selection of these submittals, if made, may be based on various considerations, including without limitation; Respondent’s experience and/or qualifications, past experience, administrative cost, standardization, technical evaluation and oral and/or written presentations as required.”*

However, we do not see a request for information on *administrative cost* and *standardization* in the RFQ. Please clarify.

Due to the fact this is the first time the Biennial Transmission Planning Process is being completed in the FRCC, no administrative cost or standardization information is required nor will be considered at this time. Furthermore, FRCC has not requested any oral presentations at this time. Such items could be considered in future Requests for Qualifications or future Scope Requests that may be issued.

Question 5:

Is there a specific requirement for the designated team to be based out of an office in Florida or can the work be performed at location outside of Florida in an office in North America?

There is no requirement for a physical office location within the State of Florida. However, the selected consultant may need to attend periodic face-to-face meetings with FRCC staff through FRCC's Biennial Transmission Planning Process.
